Delivering the right medical equipment to Ukrainians

With consultation from a team of American doctors and input from their Ukrainian counterparts, we ensure that the medical machinery we deliver to Ukraine is not only of high quality, but is uniquely situated to support the needs of Ukrainians throughout the war and the years to come.

For example, the X-Ray machines we have supplied are designed and manufactured in Ukraine, which means that the service and parts are available locally.

We also ensured that they are easily portable so that they could be quickly relocated to another floor or wing in case the hospital is bombed and the elevator is inoperative.

To date we have delivered \$19M worth of equipment to Ukraine and have spent \$5M on medication and consumables.

Saving the most vulnerable lives in Ukraine


Due to the stress of war, the rate of babies being born prematurely in Ukraine has increased dramatically—with some hospitals reporting as many as 40% of babies being born prematurely.

Pioneer Natural Resources, an energy company putting their unexpected oil and gas profits to a moral cause, have granted an additional \$2M to Nova Ukraine to address the neonatal crisis.

The funds are being used to purchase incubators, warmers, and resuscitation tables for the smallest of patients and their mothers.



Of highest priority are incubators with self-contained power sources—the kind that can easily be moved in case of bombing and used during power outages.

Six Months of Dangerous Rescues

Helping Civilians Reach Safety

From the onset of the war, a priority for us has been assisting Ukrainians who live in heavily shelled zones evacuate and resettle to safer areas.

We have partnered with local organizations, like Help People and Yangoli Spasinya, who are evacuating civilians from dangerous areas like the Donetsk, Kharkiv and Luhansk regions.

They have assisted thousands of people to date, including many who are wounded and disabled and in need of special assistance.





Costly and Hazardous

Evacuation drivers undertake daily risk in order to save lives from the most dangerous regions of Ukraine.

As a result of shelling and close proximity to active fighting, as well as rough road conditions, evacuation vehicles are in frequent need of repair, and the cost of both fuel and replacement vehicles and parts is expected to keep rising during the winter months.

Although this work is costly, your impact is clear. Every \$100 donation is one life saved.

Working Strategically

Many of our partners who carry out evacuations strategically fill their tour buses and sprinter vans with food packs, and deliver them to the civilians who remain in front line cities, which ensures that the fuel and van used on the trip there are still optimized for impact.



Each relief Package Supports a Family **Up to 7 Days**

Our partners are able to reach and support citizens in occupied regions like Mariupol, Melitopol, and Kherson, as well as newly liberated villages in the Kharkiv region.

Within days of liberation, our partners are delivering food aid to citizens and assisting with evacuations.

Six Months of Restoration

With your help, we can help restore schools for the children of Ukraine.



Usually September 1st marks the first day of the school year for Ukrainian children, but **since the start of the war, over 2,000 schools have been completely destroyed by shelling** so many children no longer have a school to return to. We understand the potential impact this disruption of their education may have, so our volunteers have been hard at work to restore schools by replacing windows, rebuilding walls, and patching holes in schools across the country with the hope that children will be able to return to school in the near future.

Iryna suffered the greatest loss imaginable in Bucha.

When invaders came to her quiet village, Iryna's brother and husband insisted that the women flee, while the men stayed behind to defend their home. Iryna left with her mother and son over the collapsed Irpin bridge, narrowly escaping gunfire. All communication with her loved ones was lost. When she returned, she found her life completely destroyed—her home in ruins, and her husband and brother killed in their own yard.

While the trauma Iryna lived through cannot be restored, **our construction crew Helping Hand helped repair her home in time for winter.** They installed new windows, repaired the leaking roof, covered up the gunshots and holes in the stucco, and cleared the fallen debris.

But sadly Iryna's story is not unique. Even as we still struggle to process the losses in Bucha, new reports of atrocities are coming from Izyum, and other newly liberated villages in Ukraine. **The work to rebuild is only beginning.**

Six Months of Providing Psychological Aid

Helping children cope with the psychological effects of the war

We have placed a special focus on helping the children affected by this war by funding projects which provide them with psychological aid. The goal of these projects is to support the most vulnerable of children, those from previously occupied zones like Mariupol and Melitopol, children of Ukrainian military soldiers, and children who are newly orphaned.



To date, we have funded 23 projects which have served 1,294 children. The projects we have supported include sport camps, mathematical events, dance competition trips, library projects, among others.

The goal is to provide these children with a chance to relax, play, and, importantly, an opportunity to receive psychological support from experts in a safe environment.



Many Ukrainian children have been subjected to traumas of war which no child should ever experience. These projects allow them to be children again, while also providing them with trauma therapy, PTSD treatment, and psychological resilience training.

This is an initiative which is very close to our hearts, and we will continue to support projects which provide these children with relief from the cruelty of the war.

EVACUATING FROM RUSSIA

For many refugees in occupied zones, the only means of escape is evacuation to Russian territory. Once in Russia, refugees are free to leave—but at their own expense.

Russian volunteers have been aiding refugees, at great personal risk, to reach the Russian border with Latvia and Estonia. From there, volunteers funded by Nova Ukraine help each family reach their final destination.

Nova Ukraine funds the relocation of refugees by providing free accommodation, airfare, and travel

expenses, as well as arranging all the travel details for each family.

One family describes: "We spoke with a volunteer and by the next day we had tickets sent to us. After crossing the border, we were contacted by another volunteer who told us what to expect in Riga, ordered our tickets for the ferry, and reserved a room for us in a hostel. The volunteers greatly simplified our journey."



Finding Host Families for Refugees in the United States

While many Ukrainians arriving in the US are reuniting with family members who sponsor them under the Uniting for Ukraine program, others come to the United States to escape the war despite no local ties or contacts.

Our emergency housing team helps connect refugees who have nowhere to go with kind hosts who are willing to open their homes to refugees.

Our Partnership with Airbnb.org

After offering free housing for over 100,000 Ukrainians through partners like Nova Ukraine, Airbnb's program to help Ukrainian refugees has come to an end.

However, we continue working with hosts offering free housing to refugees on the Airbnb platform to provide accommodation for the Ukrainians who need it.

Helping Refugees in the US

More than 100,000 Ukrainians are estimated to have arrived in the United States since March. Your support allows Nova Ukraine to help in many ways:

Looking Ahead at the Next Six Months

While the state of the war is unpredictable as we enter a grueling winter season, we are optimistic that Ukrainians will continue their inspiring resistance, but **it is important that we do not lose momentum.**

As civilian infrastructure is continuously targeted, we must prepare for a winter without stable gas or electricity. Wood burning stoves can be used for cooking and as a heat source. To date we have distributed 450 stoves in preparation for winter, and would like to do even more. We are also distributing generators to combat power outages and large quantities of water to last throughout the winter.

We will continue the critical work of evacuations and food and medical deliveries, but as food and gas prices continue to rise, **we cannot do this without your help.**
